

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# *North East Area Public Survey*

In April of 2021, the Borough of North East and North East Township initiated a process to update the North East Area Comprehensive Plan. The plan will be a joint planning effort between the two municipalities. The goals of this project are to identify a shared vision for the future of the North East Area, determine the Area's top priority issues, develop action plans to address these priorities, and to achieve the desired results.

The success of this planning effort will require the input, support, and active participation of the entire community. Although public meetings will be held as part of this process, it is not always convenient or even possible for all residents to attend these meetings.

In order to give all residents an opportunity to participate and provide input, a public survey was taken from July 13<sup>th</sup> through August 13<sup>th</sup>, 2021. Paper copies of the survey were distributed by the North East News-Journal, and were also made available at several local business locations. An online version was also available via links from both municipal websites. A total of 493 responses were received. Of these, 319 responses were submitted online, and 174 responses were submitted on paper forms.

Respondents to the survey were asked to rate the North East Area in several different areas. They were also asked to provide their opinions about priorities for several potential priority areas. The following report presents the results of the survey.









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Empty store fronts are a blight in our community and makes it look like the town is abandoned, unloved and not worth spending a lot of time in. The paintings in the empty windows were a good idea, in theory, but the style was of a lower quality/cartoonish and probably not inspiring people to want to hang out in North East or start a business here. It is like the saying goes about dressing for the job you want; North East needs to dress for the businesses we want to start up here, taking our beloved town to the next level in tourism.

We desperately need to improve the accessibility to Freeport Beach as I think most people from out of town don't know it exists or want to bother going down there. We are not only a Wine Fest/Cherry Fest town, we could be a beach town too. There is a lot of green space at Freeport that we could have some sort of family friendly "Beach Fest." For locals there could be a kite flying day or sandcastle competition, anything to generate wider community interest in Freeport.

We also woefully underuse Heard Park. What a missed opportunity for things like a community flea market, which would generate a lot of foot traffic for the local businesses. Rather than doing the community yard sale once a year, we could have a monthly flea market or much like Waterford, we could have a weekly flea market. I am positive that township residents would appreciate being able to come sell their things in a communal space and not be forgotten in the outskirts.

Another use of Heard Park could be a food truck event. Again, this would generate a lot of foot traffic to the local businesses. Our local restaurants could have tables set up with their food as well so they are not left out and get a chance to have customers they may not otherwise have sampling their food to generate future visits. These are events that our neighboring towns in the county already do, we are behind in modern/young events like these. We now know that cars will line up for a mile to buy food and support the Cherry Fest.

A lot of this hinges on the accessibility of the outdoor spaces. I believe that the borough website is making progress towards being more user friendly and updated but there is room for improvement. It is not easy to access any sort of information on how to get permits to rent spaces or how you can organize an event for the community. There needs to be more collaboration between the borough and the community with meetings, surveys, social media, possibly email blasts rather than just the journal. Honestly, it would be most helpful if there was a job position of a community event planner and a designated person that people could go to with their questions and ideas about projects, events, etc.

We need more initiatives like North East in Bloom. They have single-handedly made our town more beautiful in just a matter of a few years. It shows what a small group of people can accomplish when they are doing something they are passionate about. I think that there are more residents with gifts and talents that want to share it with the town but don't know how or where to start. Local artists, entrepreneurs, churches, etc. that could do more murals, workshops, family friendly events. I think people are unsure of how to even go about organizing events for the community. Small grants from the borough or at least more transparency from the borough website of who to contact might be a good start.

Ultimately, I think North East is under utilizing its beautiful spaces and hardworking and talented people. I think the "younger" families have a lot of ideas and love this city and want to make it better for the next generation. We just need a way for our voice to be heard and to share our thoughts and opinions. North East does a lot of things right, and I'm sure most of us love living here, but I believe the point of this survey is that we all know that we could be doing things even better. We, its residents, have it in us and we all want to see the town flourish and succeed.

This way it is not government controlled, but has input from the borough and township, but is controlled by the Board of the non profit with more access to grants and loans through federal, state and local sources, in addition to foundations. In addition, local larger businesses could contribute and use it as a charitable contribution. North East needs to come into the 21st century and have attractive businesses for our youth to work at and also to have somewhere to gather.

Our seniors also need activities and more housing. There is an overall lack of affordable housing in Erie County, but North East could attract more people with proper housing available.

The schools are very outdated along with the sports facilities. The kids and teachers deserve better. The concession stand at the football field is falling apart inside and there is no room to move, the baseball and football fields are falling apart, the lockers in the schools are too small for the kid's belongings, cosmetically the schools are still in the 70's, the high school should have air conditioning and the outside should be welcoming and bright to invite the students to a great campus.

North East is a great community, but too many of the same old people have said "that is the way we have always done it." It is time for change and for new, youthful ideas to be permitted and incorporated into wine country to develop the area for the future. I am happy to share more ideas.

That would be a disaster be it either pull in or back in. Something needs to be done with the graffiti on the underpass on 89. Municipalities need to update their websites in a timely fashion. Still waiting on that "Coming Soon" Sunset Cam on the Borough's website. Borough vehicles should not occupy parking areas in front of the building, those spaces should be left for residents who need to go there. Would be nice if the Borough would remove some of the hardscape that encompasses the side and front of the building. Would be nice to at least have a couple trees planted in front of the building instead of having concrete everywhere. There is a need for housing that is one floor for aging residents to move to. Don't know what issues may arise with the sale of the Mercyhurst property.
